News on the project's progress

LTTA in Ruse, Bulgaria

Young people with an interest or experience in social entrepreneurship from partner countries came together in Ruse, Bulgaria for a training event called Learning, Teaching, Training Activity (LTTA). They were selected by project partners from Bulgaria, Italy, Portugal, Greece, and Cyprus. The host organization, Bulgarian-Romanian Chamber of Commerce, designed a 3-day program with two main goals: to train young entrepreneurs and youth workers on the project's learning resources, and to evaluate the project's quality and content for improvement.

During the LTTA, participants gained firsthand experience with the startup environment in Bulgaria, shared information about their own countries, and discussed European trends with representatives from other nations. They also had the opportunity to explore and discuss three project results: a Training Package for Sustainability in Social Enterprises, a Social Enterprises Simulation Game, and a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) for fostering social entrepreneurship.

According to participant feedback, the most exciting part of the event was the Social Enterprises Simulation Game, in which they actively participated. The LTTA served as a platform to establish a community of practice, which proved to be vital for the project's quality and highly beneficial for all participants.








Current status
