Connecting Nature and Eco-Tourism in Europe

We are excited to introduce you to WILDSCAPE EU, a 2-year project funded with the support of the Erasmus + programme. The project is motivated by the EU's commitment to preserving biodiversity and promoting sustainable tourism in Europe. It aims to empower youth in rural areas, foster environmental conservation, and support socioeconomic development while providing tools for future generations to respect and protect nature.



Project Outcomes:

1. A Transnational Report on Biodiversity and ecotourism, which will outline the status of biodiversity and the potential for ecotourism in each participating country.

2. The development of sustainable tourism standards through focus groups and the collection of territorial data. 3. The creation of an ecotourism platform: an interactive online hub that will provide resources, tools, and training materials for ecotourism. 4. Policy recommendations and the design of tourism packages.

At this meeting partners discussed the project objectives, outcomes, work packages and each partners responsibilities going forward in the project.
